# EMPOWERING VOICES




Mae Meredith Miller yn nofelydd ac yn feirniad llenyddol sy'n byw ym Mro Ddyfi ac mae bellach yn cyhoeddi gyda gwasg Honno. Mae ganddi PhD o Sussex ac mae'n darlithio ym Mhrifysgol Caerdydd. Caiff ei thrydded nofel, *Fall River*, ei chyhoeddi gan Honno ym mis Mawrth 2024 a bydd ei stor i fer ddiweddaraf, 'Not from an Astronomer', yn cael ei chynnwys yn rhifyn 6 Cylchgrawn Llenyddol Tamarind. Mae Meredith yn siarad Cymraeg ac mae'n aelod o Gylch Llenyddol Bro Ddyfi.

Meredith Miller is a novelist and literary critic who lives in Bro Ddyfi and now publishes with Gwasg Honno. She holds a PhD from Sussex and lectures at Cardiff University. Her third novel, *Fall River*, is forthcoming from Honno in March 2024 and her most recently published short story, 'Not from an Astronomer', will appear in issue 6 of *Tamarind Literary Magazine*. Meredith is a Welsh speaker and member of Cylch Llenyddol Bro Ddyfi.



Gwenno Dafydd, M.Sc.Econ (Women's Studies) brings three strands of expertise to her work - A professional career in broadcasting and performance since 1980, Equal Opportunities and Diversity at board SME level and Coaching at Leadership level since 1998 in personal development and public speaking. A global podcaster on many subjects relating to leadership and breaking through the glass ceiling, she has clients in India, America, Turkey, Greece, Spain, Canada and Australia. The published author of 'Stand up & Sock it to them Sister, Funny Feisty Females', she writes lyrics and performs a one-woman show about the French singer Edith Piaf.



Rufus Mufasa

Literary activist Rufus Mufasa is a pioneering participatory artist who advocates hip hop education and poetry development accessible to all. Lyricist, rapper and performance art poet, with an MA in scriptwriting. Co-founder of Swynraig, a group of women who explore culture, the arts and language.

Rufus is a Hay Writer at Work, supports several intergenerational projects, mentors men at Parc Prison and she recently headlined the Helsinki Literature Festival. As well as being the first Welsh artist to perform at Ruisrock festival, she mentors Finnish beat poets, and now writes trilingually as a result.



Tia-zakura Camilleri

Mae Tia-zakura Camilleri yn artist creadigol o Gaerdydd sy'n defnyddio barddoniaeth, creu theatr a newyddiaduraeth fel dulliau actifiaeth, gan ganolbwysti ar hyrwyddo lleisiau duon. Yn fwyaf adnabyddus mae ei dull rhythmic o 'floetry', gellir gweld Tia yn perfformio ei darnau llafar ar draws y Deyrnas Unedig, gan gynnwys ei phrosiect diweddaraf yn Amgueddfa Victoria ac Albert. Ym mis Hydref 2023, cyhoedwyd Tia am y tra cyntaf fel un o'r awdurion ar gyfer y llyfr 'Cymru & I', a guradwyd gan Inclusive Journalism Cymru. O hyn, mae Tia wedi parhau â'i gwaith llenyddiaeth ac ar hyn o bryd mae wrthi'n datblygu ei blodeugerdd gyntaf.

Tia-zakura Camilleri is a creative from Cardiff who uses poetry, theatre making and journalism as tools of activism, focussing on amplifying black voices. Best known for her rhythmic approach to 'floetry', Tia can be seen performing her spoken-word pieces across the UK, including her most recent project at the Victoria & Albert Museum. In October 2023, Tia was published for the first time as one of the writers for the book 'Cymru & I', curated by Inclusive Journalism Wales. From this, Tia has continued her pursuit in literature and is currently in the process of developing her first anthology.



Faith Buckley

Mae Faith MW Buckley yn Artist Llefaru ac yn Gyd-sylfaenydd Prosiect Full Spectrum, gweler y prosiect ar Facebook @fullspectrumproject. Mae Faith yn cynnal Spectrum Live, digwyddiad bob 6 wythnos sy'n dod â thalent orau de Cymru mewn Cerdoriaeth, Llefaru, Comedi a Barddoniaeth ynghyd. Mae hi'n eiriolwr dros amrywiaeth ym maes y celfyddydau yng Nghymru, gyda llawer o'i gwaith yn canolbwysti ar y gymuned LGBTIQ+, colled a pherthyn. Daeth yn ail ym Ngwobr Barddoniaeth Cymru 2021 ac mae ar hyn o bryd yn gweithio ar ei chasgliad cyntaf o gerddi. Pan nad yw hi'n ysgrifennu neu'n perfformio, mae Faith yn cadw'n brysur gyda'i theulu ac yn fwy na dim yn mwynhau cael hwyl gyda'i gŵr, eu 4 o blant a'u 2 gi ar arfordioredig godidog Cymru.

Faith MW Buckley is Spoken Word Artist and Co-founder of The Full Spectrum Project, find the project on Facebook @fullspectrumproject. Faith hosts Spectrum Live, a 6 weekly event bringing together, the best of South Wales' talent in Music, Spoken Word, Comedy and Poetry. She is an advocate for diversity in the Welsh Arts Scene, with many of her works focusing on the LGBTIQ+ community, loss and belonging. Runner up in Wales Poetry Award 2021 & currently working on her first collection of poems. When not writing and performing, Faith is kept busy with her family and enjoys nothing more than having fun with her husband, 4 children and 2 dogs in the beautiful Welsh vistas and coastlines.



Rhoda Thomas

Rhoda Thomas is a founder member of Swansea-based Live Poets, providing a platform and support to Welsh radical writer/ performers. She has self-published a life-advice compendium and 5 books of poetry. Her work is included in publications such as Red Poets, Seventh Quarry, Poetry in the Brew (Nashville), Coronaverse, Onward/Ymlaen!, Gwthryfel/Uprising, Land of Change, Social Work Education, Socialist Worker and Socialist Review. Rhoda has two Masters degrees – in Applied Psychology and Cultural Awareness, and has taught social workers, counsellors and doctors over 4 decades. She is currently working on her autobiography covering 40 years of life and activism in Wales.

Helgard Krause

Originally from Germany, Helgard moved to Wales in 2005. She learned Welsh to take up the role of Head of Sales & Marketing at the Books Council of Wales. She was appointed to her current role as Chief Executive of the Books Council of Wales in 2017. Helgard is a Fellow of the Learned Society in Wales, and since 2019 has been named by *The Bookseller Magazine* as one of 150 Most Influential People in British Publishing. She has been a member of the non-executive board of Creative Wales since 2020 and has served as an independent panel member for public appointments by Welsh Government.



Sarah Johnson

Sarah Johnson is Deputy Publisher at Seren, Wales's leading independent literary publisher, specialising in English-language writing from Wales. She was named a Bookseller Rising Star in 2022 and has a first-class degree in English Language with Creative Writing from Bangor University. As Head of Marketing and Publicity, she launched The Seren Poetry Podcast in 2022. For six months in 2023, she took on the role of Acting CEO. Outside of work, Sarah plays in a brass band and is developing a number of fiction projects.



Jannat Ahmed was born and grew up in Barry and is co-founder of Lucent Dreaming, an independent creative writing magazine and book publisher. As well as working as an editor, she is an occasional poet, writer, illustrator and teacher. In 2023 she was a finalist in the national St David Awards for her contribution to culture. Yn flaenorol, roedd Penny yn olygydd ffuglen yn Seren. Yn raddedig yn y Saesneg, mae hi hefyd yn newyddiadurw hyfforddiedig, a bu'n gweithio mewn papurau newydd dyddiol am 14 mlynedd. Mae hi'n byw yng Nghaerdydd gyda'i hen sbaniei.

Penny Thomas is an award-winning editor and Publisher at Firefly Press, which she co-founded with Janet Thomas ten years ago to publish quality fiction for 5-19 year olds. In that time Firefly has won the Branford Boase Award for best first children's novel and the Yoto Carnegie Medal, as well as being named Wales Small Press of the year in 2020, 2021 and 2023. Previously Penny was fiction editor at Seren. An English graduate, she is also a trained journalist, having worked in daily newspapers for 14 years. She lives in Cardiff with her elderly spaniel.
