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Choral Scholarships – Application Notes

- 1. Choral Scholarships are available only to students currently enrolled on taught degree programmes.
- 2. You may not hold a choral scholarship concurrently with an instrumental scholarship or sports scholarship.
- 3. The closing date for choral scholarship applications is 15th October each year.
- 4. Please submit the following application materials:
 - a. Completed application form;
 - b. Copies/scans of certificate and marks sheet for any singing exams you have taken;
 - c. Completed referee forms (these may be sent in separately by the referees).
- 5. Referees should be people who can comment on your musicianship in a professional capacity (e.g. teachers, conductors, etc), and should not be related to you.
- 6. Shortlisted applicants will be invited to an audition, which will consist of the following elements:
 - a. Performance of a piece chosen by the applicant;
 - b. A short piece of sightreading, selected from a representative choral work;
 - c. Some simple aural test;
 - d. A short interview.
