

Types of Student Car Parking Permits

1) Permit For Students Who Require Reasonable Adjustments for Medical Issues

If you require a reasonable adjustment/parking permit due to a medical condition in order to facilitate your studies, you are able to apply for one.

If you hold this kind of car parking permit, you are able to park in specific parking bays on both campuses.

This parking permit can also be used by carers for students who are unable to drive.

Once you've completed your application form, you can return it to our Disability Office by emailing disability@swansea.ac.uk. You may need to provide supporting evidence, which the team will advise you on.

2) Permit For Students with Dependent Children in the University Crèche

Download the application form or collect one from the Crèche Manager. Her name is Tracey Knuska and she's based at The Crèche, Grove Building Extension, Singleton Park Campus.

Once you've completed your application form, you can [return it by email to the nursery itself](#). You may need to provide supporting evidence.

3) Permit For Students on Sports Scholarships

To apply, email the [Sporting Recruitment and Events Officer](#) for an application form. Submit your completed application form by email to the same email address once you've completed it.

Once authorised, the Sporting Recruitment and Events Officer will contact you to inform you when and where to collect your permit.

The cost of this particular permit is included in the scholarship or bursary. Students holding this type of car parking permit will be able to park on either campus.

4) Permit For Students Living Outside Swansea University Bus Zone Area

If you live in any of the numbered zones in the image below, you are eligible to apply for an annual car parking permit.



Spaces are limited and permits will be issued according to priority; with those living farthest away from the bus zone area being given first priority.

The permit allows a maximum of 4 people per car to travel to and from the Fabian Way Park and Ride.

There are two to choose from -

- **The Recreation Ground Permit**- This option is best for students who will be studying at Singleton Campus. It's about a 7/8 minute walk away.

- **Fabian Way Park & Ride Permit**- This option is best for students planning to study at the Bay Campus. If you go for this option, your return bus travel between the Park & Ride and the Bay Campus will be included. These services run every 30 minutes. You can [View the Bus Timetable](#). If you'd rather, you could use a [Sandander Cycle](#) instead of jumping on the bus! The Fabian Way Park & Ride is operated by the City & County of Swansea. 5) Out of Hours Parking Permit

**apply in person at the Estates & Facilities Management Reception, First Floor, Fulton House at Singleton Campus or on the First Floor of Nanhyfer Workzone Building at the Bay Campus.*

Out of normal working hours, students with a valid out of hours parking permit can park on either campus. The permit will cost £5, and it'll entitle students to park on either campus between 4pm and 8am the following morning (Monday to Friday) and at any time on the weekend. Even if you just plan on parking at Singleton out of hours, you **MUST** purchase and display this permit. It's the same process for those of you wanting to park at the Bay Campus overnight too.

Swansea University operates an Automatic Number Plate Recognition system (ANPR) to monitor and recognise vehicles entering the university grounds. To ensure the system recognises your vehicle and does not issue you with an automatic penalty charge notice **you will need to apply for a student out of hours permit that will allow you access for both campuses.**
